BUDGET UPDATE

We're nearly halfway through the fiscal year and the state still doesn't have a completed budget. While the "main" budget bill, also called the General Appropriations bill, was passed in early July, there are a series of "code bills" that are necessary to accompany the budget to help dictate how some of that funding is doled out.

Majority House Democrats did advance both a tax code and fiscal code last month, but I could not support either bill since they would put us in a position of spending money we don't have, which would ultimately lead to tax hikes for our citizens. The last thing people need as they deal with inflation is to send more of their hard-earned money to the government.

One major sticking point in negotiations is the governor's reversal on his pledge to create a small scholarship program to help low-income families in poorly performing school districts send their child to a different school.
